Hotel, near the venue of the NATA Annual Meeting in 1986. This meeting was attended by forty-seven Japanese athletic trainers and NATA personnel, which was 10 years after a private meeting at the annual NATA convention explored the possibility of founding a professional organization in Japan. ATO is now the largest group of athletic trainers with NATA membership who reside outside of North America.

In 2014, JATO become the first official affiliate of the NATA outside of the U.S. In 2018, JATO was incorporated, 22 years since its foundation. As of 2020, more than 200 JATO members are active in a wide variety of fields, including professional leagues, Japan's national sports teams, hospitals, academic institutions, fitness and wellness facilities, local government organizations, and health-related manufacturing companies.

ince 1998, JATO has hosted 31 continuing education unit (CEU) symposiums and seminars and

issued approximately 250 CEU credits. The JATO is a charter member of the World Federation of Athletic Training and Therapy (WFATT) along with the professional organizations from U.S, Canada and other counties. In May 2019, JATO hosted the WFATT World Congress X in Tokyo with over 600 participants from around the world. JATO is also active in guiding aspiring students who wish to pursue a career in the athletic training field, hosting student-only seminars and awarding student scholarships in cooperation with NATA.
